Granite Peak Publications Announces *Yellowstone Treasures* Sixth Edition Release Date

Lake Forest Park, Wash.- March 20, 2020 – [Granite Peak Publications](#) will release the new edition of *Yellowstone Treasures: The Traveler's Companion to the National Park* on May 15, 2020. A digital review copy is available now to booksellers, librarians, and book reviewers on [Edelweiss Plus](#). The [updated sixth edition](#) includes updates by editor Beth Chapple and geologist Jo-Ann Sherwin to the introduction, road logs, geology chapter, and more. As before, this guide to America's beloved first national park features geology explanations—including of the continental divide and the Yellowstone Caldera—and history anecdotes, as well as providing charts of Yellowstone's campgrounds and facilities, informative maps, a list of out-of-the-way short hikes, and a plant and animal field guide.

In the three years since the last version of the guidebook, the many changes in the park include new overlooks on the South Rim of the Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone, a new trail to an observation point for Grand Prismatic Spring, and the surprise eruption of Ear Spring on September 15, 2018. We use data from the Geysir Observation and Study Association, GeysirTimes.org, and T.Scott Bryan's *The Geysers of Yellowstone* (University Press of Colorado, 2018) to augment our personal observations from frequent trips. For 2020, the road logs reflect changes due to construction and sport 38 new and revised maps.

For the first time, the Old Faithful Geysir cover photo is by photographer Janet Jones of Snow Moon Ink, who is also known for her website, [The Yellowstone Naturalist](#). Her images can also be seen at Open Range Images, Cody, Wyoming.
